His preaching is rich, gospel-centered, and hospitably engages the culture, making the scriptures understandable to all.

We invite you to meet the Woodrow family during the candidate weekend, **April 4 to 7**, where you can share a meal with them, hear Kent preach, and get to know them. The following week (April 14), we will vote on a call for Kent at a congregational meeting after the Sunday worship service.

who is Kent Woodrow?

Kent Woodrow currently serves as the associate pastor of Holy Cross Presbyterian Church in Staunton, Virginia. He loves Jesus, loves people, and has a deep desire for everyone to hear the Gospel. "He is gentle and full of conviction. He is willing to ask the heart-level questions that others won't, but he does it in a nonintrusive way. He has a good sense for when it's okay to ask the hard questions, and he asks them because he truly wants to know the answers," said a pastor who has known him for a decade.

Kent's childhood growing up as a missionary kid in Mozambique was not only the incubator for his relationship with the Lord, it also substantially shaped how he sees life and ministry. He moved to the states for his undergrad studies at Covenant College, where he met Anna. They married in 2014, and straightaway went to St. Louis to study at Covenant Seminary.

KENT'S PHILOSOPHY OF MINISTRY

At the end of my life, I hope all who know me can say I gave my all for the Lord, for His people, and for His world and encouraged others to do the same.

The Lord (Celebrating His Grace)

I owe my life to the Lord who loved me and rescued me, not because of anything in me but because He is just that kind of God (Eph. 2:1-10). And that kind of God deserves to be known and honored by all. That's why everything about my life and ministry centers on the Lord and His worthiness to be celebrated for who He is, for what He has done, and for offering all of this to us freely. Everything must center on Him (Rom. 11:36)!

His People (Growing in His Grace)

The Lord who graciously rescues us also graciously gives us a home among His people. Since none of us earned our way into the Lord's family, we've got nothing to prove and are free to be honest about our failures and continual need for our Lord's grace (Phil. 3:1-14). As a pastor, I seek to see the Lord's people become more like Him by cultivating communities that embrace our utter dependence upon Him. I also believe I'm called to "equip the saints" for the ministry to which the Lord calls His people (Eph. 4:11-16).

His World (Sharing His Grace)

The Lord's people are outward-facing, driven to see our God honored and more added to His people (Acts 2:42-47). Together we push into His world, knowing how desperately others need to hear of the grace our Lord offers in language they can understand and offering them a glimpse into the world as our Lord made it to run (Mat. 5:13-16). I see my task as a pastor to keep the Lord's mission before His people for the good of His world and the honor of our God (Ps. 96:1-6).
